OVERAL PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Proposed Project will deploy an Advanced Connected Transportation Infrastructure & Operations Network (ACTION) on freeways and arterials in and around Tuscaloosa, Alabama. ACTION initiative's core theme is to leverage technological advances to enhance efficiency, capability, and safety. A multi-agency partnership will work collaboratively on the ACTION initiative. The partnership includes the Alabama Transportation Institute (ATI) at The University of Alabama (UA), the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT), The Tuscaloosa County Road Improvement Commission (TCRIC), the cities of Tuscaloosa and Northport, and other local and regional industry stakeholders, including manufacturing and trucking.

ACTION will streamline traffic flow to improve mobility on the region's road network during both normal operations and situations when roadway capacity or traffic demands adversely affect traffic operations (e.g., events that generate significantly higher traffic volumes, events that reduce roadway capacity, inclement weather, and other emergency situations). It will substantially mitigate congestion, improve travel time reliability, and enhance safety for motorists and pedestrians in the region, all of which are critical for the region's economic vitality and interstate commerce.

Key components of ACTION include a network of sensors and cameras, communications technologies, and traffic signal systems, as well as mobility tools for passenger and freight traffic. These will facilitate near real-time exchange of data among vehicles, network elements, and users. Facets of ACTION include user functionality embedded in existing mobility apps for motorists and pedestrians, responsive traffic signals, and smart work zones. These will enable agencies to implement operational strategies based on real-time demand and capacity, allowing motorists to respond proactively to such changes. These capabilities will result in reduced congestion, increased travel time reliability, and improved safety and will thus yield significant economic and environmental benefits.

PS&E Abbreviated Scope of Work

The core team for ACTION has determined the need and will seek professional engineering consultant services (in accordance with UA policies) to provide specific support on project elements such as developing PS&E documents required for the project. A Professional Engineering firm will be selected to help identify key technology elements.

Portion of Work Requiring Professional Engineering Services

No major construction is envisioned as part of the ACTION project. Any construction will be incidental for the installation of the technology elements (e.g., sensor network). The incidental construction components in this project will relate to the technology deployments (e.g., sensors, signal controllers, poles and fiber optic communication links, and switches). The portion of work listed below will require Professional Engineering services/PS&E documents.

- Pole & Foundation: 21 sensor locations will require 70-ft direct-bury galvanized steel poles at each location. Poles will be used to mount PTZ/advance cameras and the volume, speed, and classification sensors. Poles will be spaced approximately 1 to 2 miles apart within a 32 mile stretch of I-20/59.
- Freeway Fiber Optics Network: To provide communications to the sensors deployed on the freeway, approximately 32 miles of fiber optic communication will need to be installed to link each camera location to the RMTC.
- **Connected Freeway:** Installation of 21 PTZ cameras in freeway right of way for advance video detection systems.

After the necessary and required engineering documents are completed, the appropriate

project elements will be put out for bid and awarded accordingly (in accordance with UA's policies). All construction bid packages will be competitively bid in compliance with the State of Alabama Public Works Law (Code of Alabama, Title 39) and Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) requirements.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Experience with interstate design, arterial roadway design, roadway bridge projects, railroad crossings, roadway design for Urban Collector's in an institutional environment, and including experience with next-generation sensor and traffic control systems and communication platforms.
- The Professional Engineering firm will be responsible for providing engineering designs to satisfy the UA design standards and guidelines, the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) codes and standards, as well as any other applicable code for this type of project.

SELECTION PROCESS:

Upon receipt, submittals will be evaluated by the Selection Committee. The Selection Committee will rank the Professional Engineering firms accordingly to participate in oral Interviews (usually top three). A project program (if applicable or complete) will be sent to all top ranked Professional Engineering firms to assist with their oral interviews. Following oral interview evaluations, the top ranked A/E firms will be recommended to the Board of Trustees for approval. A contract will be negotiated with the top-ranked A/E firm as approved by the Board of Trustees. If a contract can be negotiated, then that firm will be selected. If a contract cannot be negotiated, then negotiations with the next highest ranked A/E firm will commence until an agreement satisfactory to UA is reached. Preference shall be granted to an Alabama-based firm when qualities are comparable.

University of Alabama Designer Insurance Requirements

- 1.01 Upon execution of the Agreement, the Designer shall procure the insurance coverages identified below at the Designer's own expense, and to evidence that such insurance coverages are in effect, the Designer shall furnish and attach to the Agreement insurance certificate(s) acceptable to the Owner and listing the Owner as the certificate holder. The Board of Trustees of the University of Alabama, its individual trustees, officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives shall also be named additional insured and shall be indicated on the certificate.
- 1.02 <u>Policy Providers:</u> Each of the insurance coverages required below shall be issued by an insurer licensed by the Insurance Commissioner to transact the business of insurance in the State of Alabama for the applicable line of insurance, and such insurer must have a Best Policyholders Rating of "A-" or better and a financial size rating of Class VII or larger.

The Designer may elect to participate in a group self-insured workers' compensation program or to qualify with the State of Alabama Department of Industrial Relations as an individual self-insured employer, as long as the self-insurance program is in good standing with the Department of Industrial Relations and the Designer has excess workers' compensation insurance to cover all statutory obligations above the amount they have been authorized to self-insure.

- 1.03 Notification Endorsement: Each policy shall be endorsed to provide that the insurance company agrees that the policy shall not be canceled, changed, allowed to lapse or allowed to expire for any reason until thirty days after the Owner has received written notice by certified mail as evidenced by return receipt or until such time as other insurance coverage providing protection equal to protection called for herein shall have been received, accepted and acknowledged by the Owner. Such notice shall be valid only as to the project as shall have been designated by Project Name and Number in said notice.
- **1.04 Insurance Certificates:** Insurance certificates must provide the following information:
 - 1. Name and address of authorized agent of the insurance company
 - 2. Name and address of insured
 - 3. Name of insurance company or companies
 - 4. Description of policies
 - 5. Policy Number(s)
 - 6. Policy Period(s)
 - 7. Limits of liability
 - 8. Name and address of Owner as certificate holder / additional insured
 - 9. Project Name and Number, if any
 - 10. Signature of authorized agent of the insurance company licensed to transact business in the State of Alabama
 - 11. Telephone number of authorized agent of the insurance company
 - 12. Mandatory thirty day notice of cancellation / non-renewal / change
 - 13. The certificate of insurance must include the following language:

 The Board of Trustees of the University of Alabama, its individual trustees, officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives are included as an additional insured as respect to the Commercial General Liability & Excess/Umbrella policy. Unless precluded by law or restricted or modified by contract, all policies waive the right to recovery or subrogation against the Board of Trustees of the University of Alabama, its individual trustees, officers,

- directors, employees, agents and representatives.
- 14. If applicable, the certificate shall identify any policy(s) with an aggregate limit on a "per job" or "per project" basis.
- **1.05** Designer's Insurance Coverages: Unless otherwise provided in the Special Provisions of the Agreement, the Designer shall purchase the types of insurance coverages with liability limits not less than as follows:
 - 1. **Workers' Compensation** coverage shall be provided in accordance with the statutory coverage required in Alabama. A group or individual self-insurer must submit a certificate of authority from the Alabama Department of Industrial Relations approving the group insurance plan. The Designer must provide evidence of statutory excess insurance to cover any obligation in excess of the amount allowed to be self-insured by the State of Alabama.
 - 2. **Employer's Liability Insurance** limits shall be at least:

Bodily Injury by Accident - \$1,000,000 each accident Bodily Injury by Disease - \$1,000,000 each employee

3. **Commercial General Liability Insurance**, written on an ISO Occurrence Form (current edition as of the date of this Agreement) or equivalent, which shall include, but need not be limited to, coverage for bodily injury and property damage arising from premises and operations liability, products and completed operations liability, personal injury liability and contractual liability.

The Commercial General Liability Insurance shall provide, at minimum, the following limits:

CoverageLimitGeneral Aggregate\$ 2,000,000.00Products, Completed Operations Aggregate\$ 2,000,000.00Personal and Advertising Injury\$ 1,000,000.00 per OccurrenceEach Occurrence\$ 1,000,000.00

The Commercial General Liability Insurance policy shall name the Owner and its individual trustees, officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives as additional insureds and shall state that this coverage shall be primary insurance for the additional insureds.

- 4. **Commercial Business Automobile Liability Insurance** which shall include coverage for bodily injury and property damage arising from the operation of any owned, non-owned or hired automobile. The Commercial Business Automobile Liability Insurance Policy shall provide not less than \$1,000,000 Combined Single Limits for each occurrence and shall name the Owner, and their agents, consultants and employees as additional insureds.
- 5. **Professional Liability (Errors & Omissions) Insurance** shall be carried in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 for each claim and \$2,000,000 aggregate.
- 6. **Excess/Umbrella Liability** The required General Liability, Business Auto Liability or Employers Liability limits may be accomplished through a combination of primary and excess/umbrella liability policies written on a follow-form basis. The excess/umbrella liability

coverage shall be included on the certificate of insurance and the certificate holder shall be included as an additional insured.

1.06 <u>Designer's Consultants' Insurance Coverages</u>:

- 1. **Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance.** The Designer shall require each of its consultants who will perform services at the Project site to obtain and maintain Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance coverages as described in preceding Article 17.05 Item 1.
- 2. **Automobile and General Liability Insurance.** The Designer shall require each of its consultants who will perform services at the Project site to obtain and maintain Automobile and General Liability, Insurance coverages with the limits described in preceding Article 17.05 Item 3 & 4.
- 3. **Professional Liability Insurance.** The Designer shall require each of its consultants to obtain and maintain Professional Liability Insurance with coverage as described in preceding Article 17.05 Item 5.
- 4. **Enforcement Responsibility.** The Designer shall have responsibility to enforce its consultants' compliance with these insurance requirements; however, the Designer shall, upon request, provide the Owner acceptable evidence of insurance for any consultant.
- **1.07** Termination of Obligation to Insure: Unless otherwise expressly provided in the Special Provisions of the Agreement, the obligation of the Designer and its consultants to insure as provided herein shall continue as follows:
 - 1. **Professional Liability (Errors & Omissions) Insurance** shall be carried for two years after the last Date of Substantial Completion of the Construction Contract(s).
 - 2. **Other Insurance:** The obligation to carry the other insurance coverages of preceding Article 17.05 or coverages equal to them, shall remain in effect after the last Date of Substantial Completion of the Construction Contract at any time the Designer, its consultants, anyone directly or indirectly employed by them or anyone for whose acts they may be liable, returns to the Project to perform services required of the Agreement, but in no case shall be less than 24 months beyond the Date of Substantial Completion.
- 1.08 <u>Waivers of Subrogation</u>: To the extent that loss or damage is covered by property insurance during construction, the Owner and Designer waive all rights against each other and against the contractors, consultants, agents and employees of the other for damages, except such rights as they may have to proceeds of such insurance held by the Owner, Designer, or Contractor as fiduciary. The Owner or Designer, as appropriate, shall require of the contractors, consultants, agents and employees of any of them similar waivers in favor of the other parties enumerated herein. This waiver shall not be applicable to loss or damage that occurs after final acceptance of the Work.
- **1.09** Deductibles and Self-insured Retentions ("SIR"): The Designer may elect to secure an insurance program with a deductible or SIR of up to \$25,000 without prior approval from the University. Any deductible or SIR larger than this amount must be approved by the Owner and audited

financials will be required to judge the financial ability to absorb the obligations of a deductible or SIR without a material impact on the solvency of the contractor.

1.10 <u>Impairment of Limits</u>: In the event the insurance program required by the Owner were to have any pending claim(s), which <u>may</u> limit or exhaust any aggregate limits by more than 20%, the Owner shall be notified within 30 days. The Owner may require additional insurance or reinstatement of the limits of liability, as necessary to protect the financial interest of the Owner.
